Shift Happens - Change Happens and if you are going to succeed going forward you've got to understand what has shifted and how it affects you and your organisation, town and community.



The key to owning your future is knowing and optimising your important assets. What is that makes you unique and how you can optimise it to succeed.




In other words, you need to Be Who You Be! The African American slang that really says more than meets the eye. Be Who You Be MAAAAAAAN!

If we spend too much time comparing ourselves to others, we fail to see the greatness in us. I know this because when I was young I won an award at school and I didn't want to go on the stage the next day to receive it because of my shoes that were torn. When I told my grandmother she spoke to my grandfather and he gave me his special shoes, but they were too big for me. My grandmother got some newspapers and stuffed them in the front of the shoes and I tried them on, I was so embarrassed and feeling sorry for myself and my grandmother said "stop feeling sorry for yourself, remember it's you who's going to be on that stage tomorrow and not all the people you're comparing yourself too." The great story about a small tripe in South Africa that did just that. At the turn of the century, in the early 1900's the Bafokeng Nation sent young men to the mines so that they could buy and have deeds to their ancestral land. When they had the deeds the Apartheid laws of 1948 meant that Black people couldn't own land so they entrusted their deeds to the white missionaries in their land. Later Platinum deposits were discovered in their land and mining companies started mining in the early 70's. When South Africa became a democratic country the Bafokeng claimed back their land and the mining companies had to pay them for all the years they mined their land. They became billionaires but what's inspiring the world about this nation is that they have improved the lives of their people in the 13 villages that make up their Nation. They built a state of the art schools, a world class stadium and roads and services for all their villages. When you know what you have and optimise it you own the future



The world is changing and to own the future our communities and municipalities will need to understand and connect to the changing world around us.



We all have a worldview, a way we see the world, just like lenses. These are formed by where and when we grew up as these shape our view of the world. By the time we are 10 our values about what's normal and weird are well entrenched.



The first worldview is a generational one. We need to get a handle on the changing generational demographics. In the US for the next 15 years, 10,000 people per day will turn 65 years old, and (presumably) retire shortly thereafter. Here in Canada, the Baby Boomers, are also retiring at an ever increasing rate and often leaving a huge gap because of skills shortage in our economy. Countries like Italy will have to get about 2 million young immigrants a year for the next few years to keep their productivity.



Generation Xers easily bored, love change and now more of them have to grapple with being the new baby boomers and take the lead and many are not interested in the task.





To own the future we need clarity over facts but often we are caught by surprise...




How often does this happen to us, where we fail to see what we need to see before it's too late?
